I have these 1880 and 1900 (Soundex) Censuses for several other states (and plan to secure them for all states) and will publish these in future issues.

I appreciate your continued membership, support and participation, and I hope that you have found the Upshaw Family Journal both interesting and informative.

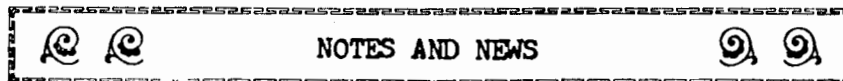

Charles Alfred Upshaw

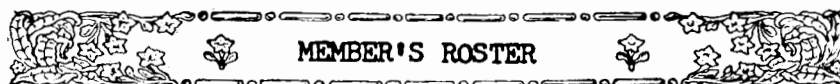
(The Atlanta Journal, Tuesday, Oct. 12, 1982)

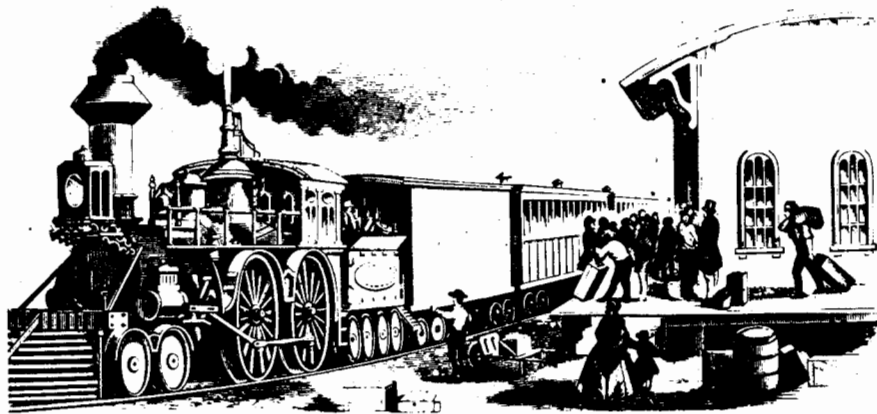

Upshaw and then after her death that the said slave and her increase shall go to the children of the said Mary Virginia which she may have to be equally divided among them for which purpose and to which intent alone this deed is intended Now therefore it is the express understanding of the parties to these presents that the aforesaid conveyance is for the uses and purposes aforesaid viz that the said John K. Yerger his heirs and assigns is to hold the aforesaid negro slave for the use benefit and enjoyment of the aforesaid Mary Virginia Upshaw during her lifetime free from the controul of her said Husband and his creditors and after her death remainder to her children in fee simple forever

Col. Arthur Martin Montgomery Upshaw was Inspector General and Brigade Major in Armstrong's Brigade of Tenn. Volunteers in the Indian War in Florida in 1836. (Source: National Archives, Military Service Records)

A. M. M. Upshaw of Pulaski, Tenn., was appointed by President Andrew Jackson on March 9, 1837, as Superintendent of the Chickasaw Indian Removal. (Source: Indian Removal by Grant Foreman, 1932)

After leaving the Chickasaw Nation in 1850, Col. A. M. M. Upshaw moved to Chappell Hill, Washington County, Texas, and purchased a 483½ acre plantation which he called "The Hermitage". He was a Charter Member of Hubert Masonic Lodge No. 67 at Chappell Hill, organized in October 1850. He was a member of the Vestry of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Chappell Hill when it was organized in 1851.
