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# THE EDITORS DESK



The Upshaw records of Bartow County, Georgia are presented in this issue. Please note that when this county was created in 1832, it was named "Cass" and remained so until 1861, when it was renamed "Bartow". See UFJ Vol. I, page 57 for the 1840 Census of Bartow County, which is the only item from this county previously printed. The family of John J. Upshaw, son of James, was evidently missed in the 1850 Census, as they appear to have been living there in 1850, yet do not appear in the Census, and they do not appear in any other area in that year. It is also unfortunate that Marriage Book C, 1843-1849, is missing, as it may contain marriage records of Clara, Mildred, and Jeanette Upshaw, which we have not found. I know these Bartow County Records will fill a great gap in research in this area, which I hope you will find interesting.

In the last several issues of UFJ, I have reported all Upshaws listed in the 1880, 1900 and 1910 (Soundex) Census Index for Tennessee, which included many Upshaws of the black race who are not, of course, descended from William Upshaw of Essex County, Virginia. There are, however, sound reasons for reporting all Upshaws, white and black, as found listed on these post-Civil War Census indexes. First, there is the possibility there may be an error as to the race given on the Soundex card. It also serves to identify the race of Upshaws found in other records, such as obituaries, tombstones, military records, and any data where those records do not indicate the race of the person, particularly in post-Civil War records. A case in point is of an old cemetery in rural Elbert County, Georgia, which has several Upshaw markers, thought to be of white persons by those local residents who are now collecting Elbert County Cemetery data, but shown to be black persons by the 1880 and 1900 census. This cemetery location has since been positively identified as an abandoned "black" church. So, it is simply a sound genealogical research practice to abstract all references to a surname from any source when research is of such a large scope as ours, and for us to be successful, our research must proceed in a sound and orderly manner.

I regret to report the death of Willie Roy Upshaw of Waxahachie, Texas on 23 May 1983. The newspaper notice of his death will be found in "Notes and News" column in this issue. "Cousin Roy" was one of our most energetic and tireless members, even though he was 93 years old on last Christmas day. He completed and sent to me family record sheets for most of the children and grandchildren of Middleton Upshaw of Tallapoosa County, Alabama, and he was always encouraging me in the business of the Upshaw Family Association. It is due mostly to his own efforts that the Middleton Upshaw family is as well researched as it now is, for which we appreciate him. He was a Christian, whose daily life reflected the power of the Holy Spirit in him, who now sees no more "through a glass darkly" but "face to face".

On behalf of the Upshaw Family Association, I extend our sympathy to his daughter, Mrs. Gwen Upshaw Hill of Dallas, to his brother, Mr. Forrest Upshaw of Waxahachie, and to all his family.

In our next issue, I plan to present Upshaw legal cases, as printed in The American Digest (1658-1906), which shows proof that Leroy Upshaw (RS) was alive and involved in a court case in Richmond, Virginia until 1808, which evidence has thus far gone undetected.

Willie Roy Upshaw, 93, 604 N. Grand, died Monday in Pleasant Manor Nursing Home.

Funeral services will be 11 a.m. Thursday in Boze-Mitchell Funeral Home Chapel with Dr. Leroy Fenton officiating. Burial will be in the Waxahachie City Cemetery.

Upshaw was born Dec. 25, 1889, on a farm near Van Alstyne and moved to Waxahachie two years ago from Waco. Upshaw was a retired cotton buyer with Waxahachie Cotton Mill, West Cotton Mill and retired at the age of 91 from W. D. Hunter Cotton Co. in Waco.

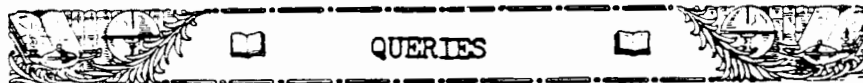
He married Beatrice DeVaughn in 1911 in Waxahachie. Upshaw was preceded in death by his wife and a son, W. Roy Upshaw, Jr.

A member of the First Baptist Church here, Upshaw was an active member of the church, was a member of the Knights of Pythias Lodge and a charter member of the Waxahachie Lions Club.

He attended Waxahachie schools and the Cumberland Business School in Dallas. Upshaw worked for the Waxahachie Transportation Company when the streetcars were muledrawn. In his later years, Upshaw had made a hobby of the local history of Waxahachie.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Gwen Upshaw Hill of Dallas; two granddaughters; a great-grandchild; a brother, Forrest Upshaw of Waxahachie; and several nieces and nephews.

Will of James Upshaw, 1847: Will Book A, pages 38, 39 (Contributed by Mr. Charles B. Upshaw, Jr., M. D., who notes that Lucinda "C." = "Carolyne").

(Note: Although this will is dated 24 March, 1847, the Will Book states that it was recorded on "3rd day of March 1847", which is obviously in conflict. As James Upshaw died on 4 Nov. 1846, it is the date of the Will which is in error and should read "24 March 1846".)

In the name of God Amen.

I, James Upshaw, of the county of cass, and State of Georgia, do make, publish, and decree this to be my last will and testament utterly revoking all former wills by me made in manner and form following:

(1st) My will is that all my just debts be paid.

(2nd) I give and bequeath unto my son, John J. Upshaw, one negro boy by the name of Richmond, and other property all together amounting to the sum of seven hundred dollars all of which property he has now in possession, to him and his heirs forever.

(3rd) I give and bequeath unto my daughter Julia Ann Maxwell one negro girl by the name of Harriet and other property all together amounting to the sum of four hundred and ten dollars, all of which property she has now in possession to her and her heirs forever.

(4th) I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Matilda Pierce, one negro girl by the name of Lisa, and other property which I shall put in her possession of to the amount of six hundred and forty dollars, to her and her heirs forever.

(5th) My will is that the whole of the rest of my estate both real and personal remain in the hands of my beloved wife, Lucinda Upshaw, during her natural life or widowhood for her to deliver to my herein after named children. That is, to give to any of my children when married or should leave her, any of my property she sees cause to spare at the true value of the same to be appraised by three persons as near the value of property at this time as possible to the amount given my son, John J. Upshaw, as a married portion, say seven hundred dollars. And my will is that she, my beloved wife, Lucinda, do whenever she thinks proper, do make my before mentioned children, to-wit, Julia Ann Maxwell and Matilda H. Pierce, the sum equal to my son John J. as a married portion, and my will is that all of the rest of my children, to wit, Polly M., Sarah E., Martha E., Lucinda C., Clara G., Thomas S., Emily C., Mildred A., and Jannette S. Upshaw, do have property or money to the amount of seven hundred dollars as married portions at the death of my beloved wife.

It should not pay the same to them before, my will is that it be at her will and pleasure to pay either of said children she thinks proper and my will is that the whole rest and residue of my estate, both real and personal (except my shop tools which I give unto my son Thomas S.), be equally divided among my before mentioned children, and I do hereby appoint my beloved wife, Lucinda, sole executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty seven(sic). And we in the presence of each other and at the request of the testator have subscribed our names as witnesses hereunto.

Will of John A. Upshaw, 1855; Will Book A, pages 126-128.

State of Georgia, Cass County)  
In the name of God Amen.

I John A. Upshaw of said state and county, being of sound mind and memory, but weak in body and knowing that it is probable that I may shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper, both as it respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind providence has blessed me, do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent Christian-like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul, I trust, shall return to rest with God who gave it.

Item 2nd. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my executor hereinafter appointed with as little delay as possible.

Item 3rd. It is my will and desire that all my property both real and personal of every kind whatever, that I may possess or be entitled unto at my death, to remain in the hands, and under the control of my Executor hereinafter named, and kept together by him for the support of my wife and children and for the education of my children; desiring that my beloved wife and children shall live together on the farm where I now live, or at such other place as my Executor may think proper to provide for them; I hereby give my Executor the power to sell any portion of my property, either real or personal, at any time, at public or private sale, that he may think proper, and to purchase other property or not as he may think proper but always to keep a comfortable home for my wife and children so long as my wife remains unmarried and any of my children unmarried or is under age. And when either of my children shall marry or arrive at twenty one years of age, it is it is (sic) my will that the whole of my estate shall then be estimated by disinterested persons, and one equal share of my whole estate (counting my wife and all my children then living and dividing the whole estate, by the number they all make) shall be set apart and paid over to said child marrying or arriving at age. I would say to you as regards cousin Louisa I would have those negroes shipped immediately (as we term the word here) and sold and let her put the money in her trunk that will insure her a competency for life it is true they are valuable negroes (gained in the ?) family but I would sell them. I think Albert ought to take them or employ someone, W. C. Wily for instant would be a good hand to carry them off secretly. I am very much surprised to learn that they are still their(sic). They should leave between supper and breakfast. You can all do as you like but if she was a sister of mine I would of had them a thousand miles from here before this.

Elizabeth Adair by whom there were: Linton, Dr. Bell of Atlanta, Paul (dec.), Elbert and Corinne of Atlanta, Thomas m. Lois Pittard (dec.) of Cartersville, and Lamar m. Lillian Goode. (b) Ella m. in 1876 Dr. William B. Vaughan, b. Nov. 7, 1855 at Cassville, died at White, Nov. 10, 1931, where he practiced medicine. In 1891 he graduated from Southern Medical College and Emory conferred an honorary degree in June, 1925; a Methodist and a Mason, the first mayor of White. Their children were: Ora m. E. C. Goode, Bessie Cheney (dec.), Lucile m. L. G. Hughes and lives in Cartersville. (c) Madison L., b. March 16, 1864, m. Irene Maxwell (dec.) by whom there were Leo (dec.), m. pages 100, 101. VINCENT, Susan Edwards: daughter of Wm. Edwards, a Revolutionary soldier and widow of Pleasant Hart Vincent of French descent, came to Cass County from DeKalb with her children in 1835 and settled in the Pine Log district. Mrs. Vincent lived until after the Civil War. She died in 1877. A Federal soldier died in her home and she buried him in her own family lot. Of her eight children, these reared families in the county: (1) Mary, b. 1809, m. Chesley Bostick by whom there is one child in the county, Mrs. Oliver Richards. (2) Aulsey Ayres, b. March 7, 1811, in Madison County, was a trader with the Indians, bought land in 1838 and in 1846 purchased 160 acres on Pine Log Creek, active in public affairs, was County Commissioner six years, a Whig and then Democrat; m. the 1st time Martha G. Upshaw by whom there were 13 children: Aulsey E. m. Agnes Adair and now lives in Plains, Ga. James U. m. Sarah Trippe and Louella Styles, died in Texas. Lucinda m. G. W. Hughes and both died in Tyler, Tex. Chesley B. m. Ida Stephens (dec.) by whom there is one daughter in the county, Lorena Barton, Malvina m. W. T. Bradford, who died in 1932, by whom there were Dela May, Clyde and Mattie (Harris), Lucius m. Sallie Mahan, daughter of David, and their daughter, Orie m. B. B. Branson of Kingston. Lula lives in Pine Log. Lorena m. L. G. Darnell (dec.), lives in Cartersville. His second wife was Mrs. Jane E. Bell, formerly Jane Lowe, by whom there were Stella, m. J. P. Adair, and Eddie, who died in Tex. His 3rd wife was Margaret McEver. (3) S. Margaret, b. 1829 in DeKalb County, m. in 1846 William Jackson Hicks, of English descent, a son of Jefferson Wyatt Hicks and Malinda Phelps, who came to this county in 1836, drew 1000 acres for service in War of 1812, fought in the Battle of New Orleans, died in 1841 and is buried in the Baker Cemetery. W. J. Hicks was a bookkeeper for Etowah Iron Company several years, went to Calif. in 1850, in 1860 enlisted in Phillip's Legion. A son of Margaret and W. J. Hicks, James John W., b. 1848, m. in 1869 Sarah C. White, at Hartwell, Ga.; served in Co. "I", 1st Ga. Cav. C.M.S., died in 1898; Lucy H. Rucker, a daughter, lives at Elberton. Eppe W.
