

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Cousin;

The Spring issue of the Upshaw Family Journal was very interesting.

I was especially interested in the letter from Mr. Robert Davidson, N.Y., about Thomas Streshley, Sr., because Thomas Streshley was my 5th great grandfather. He is buried in the Streshley burying ground at Rockland, near Rexburg, Essex County, Virginia. He died in 1735, leaving two sons, Thomas and Villiam Streshley, who both served in the Revolution; he also left one daughter, Tamazen, who married Villiam Upshaw, Jr., son of William and Hannah (Forrest) Carber Upshaw of Essex County. The tombstone of Thomas Streshley, Sr., still stands. He married Hannah and they had a daughter, Elizabeth Streshley, who married the Hugenot, Nicholas Lafon; their daughter, Mary Lafon, married my 2nd great grandfather, John Upshaw, in Aug 1769; my great grandfather, Edwin Upshaw, was their son. Reference copies of wills.

(Editor's note: The following letter is in reply to my inquirey to Mrs. Dorsey requesting further details about a letter written circa 1030 from Lincoln Parish, Louisiana, which mentions "Old Aunt Katy Upshaw"; Mrs. Dorsey would appreciate any further information about these families.)

Dear Mr. Brooke;

Your letter to Mrs. Parrott of the 13th was forwarded to me; I will try to clear up some of the confusion about the dates. I think the confusion results from the fact that I have <u>several</u> old letters. I do not have the originals of all these letters; some are copies given me by a cousin who started this work some years ago and has since passed away.

John and Esther (Liddell) Davis had a daughter, Elizabeth J., born 1816 in South Carolina. She married Thomas P. Smith, who was born 1810 in Butler County, Alabama, in 1832. He was the son of a widow, Mancy Smith, whose will was probated in Butler County in 1855, although we do not know the father's given name. The children of Thomas P. and Elizabeth J. (Davis) Smith are as follows:

E. Jane, born 1833, married John Richardson
Nancy Elizabeth, born 1835, married Moses Warren Spivey
Fredonia Caroline, born 1836, married Natthew Patterson
Andrew Daniel, born 1838, unmarried; died in the War Between the States
Rebecca T., born 1841, died young
(Thomas P. Omith died circa 1841 and Elizabeth remarried)

Perhaps this family sketch will make the letters easier to follow; now to the letters. One was written on 9 July 1855 from Greenville, Alabama, by E. Jane (Smith) Richardson to her sister Mancy Elizabeth (Smith) Spivey in Louisiana or Texas - we are not sure which but we know they moved from Louisiana to Texas between 1855 and 1857.

Cn 29 Dec 1861, A. D. Smith wrote his sister, Nancy, from Pelican Camp, Virginia, describing his life in the service. Te was killed 1 July 1862.

Actually, the only letter that refers to an Upshaw is the one from Fredonia Caroline (Smith) Patterson from Lincoln Parish, Louisiana, to her sister Mancy in Texas. The only date written on the letter is Feb. 25; I estimate the year as 1880, based on the ages of the children mentioned and events we can date. I will quote the part of interest to you:

"David Roach from Alabama was to see us this winter. James Roach from Texas also came to see us, too. James' wife died a short time before he left home. Uncle Peter Roach is in very (?) health. He has the rheumatic pains. One of the Vard Skains boys is here now." Then, in another section of the letter, she writes, "Old Aunt Katy Upshaw is living on her same old place. Annie lives with her. She is single yet. Bill Murry Skains speaks of going back after them. Dave Roach is almost rich. Old Aunt Ibby Pickens gave Dave and Tilda all she has. She bought the old Dick Bedgood place, and gave it to them. She lives with them."

I would suppose by this, the "Katy" and "Annie" were still in Alabama. The only "Katy" or Catherine Upshaw I have ever heard of was in Greenville (Butler County), Alabama, and was the wife of Leroy Upshaw, who was born in 1788 - and that was probably not the same Catherine - she would have been too old by 1880, although Upshaw's were still in Butler County, Alabama, in 1880. I included the part about "Old Aunt Ibby Pickens" since that might be a clue as to the use of the term "Old Aunt". This family did come from the same area of South Carolina as the Pickens family, so it's possible the "Aunt" had some foundation in fact but, again, not to my knowledge.

I do not think "Old Aunt Katy Upshaw" was a blood relation - at least we have never found anything that would indicate that. We have figured it was just a term of endearment used toward older friends and neighbors.

I hope this will be of some help to you. Any additional information from your readers would be appreciated. It is very difficult to do any research on the Southern states in Massachusetts libraries; most just don't have records beyond New England.

Dear Cousin Ted;

If I may be so familar; I imagine you are used to being called "Cousin" by now. In our case, we are 2nd cousins, twice removed. Your 2nd great grandfather Adkin Upshaw is my great uncle Adkin. My father, Leroy C. Upshaw, often spoke of his Uncle Adkin, as well as his other uncles, all sons of Forrester and Ann (Faulkner) Upshaw. Forrester Upshaw had brothers Drury and Richard and perhaps others.

My grandfather, Middleton Upshaw, lived within 40 miles of Atlanta in 1864 at the time the Union forces, under General Sherman, bombarded Atlanta. My father, Leroy C. Upshaw, then 9 years old, often told of hearing cannon fire at night and also of seeing part of the Union Army passing by their farm home on their way toward Atlanta, on what was known as the "Turnpike".

After the war ended, they moved to Alabama and bought a farm in the neighborhood where my mother grew up, which was several miles from Alexander (now called Alexander City) in a small village community known as Bulgers Mill. My father met my mother there in the 1870's and they were married on 23 Dec 1879, in Alexander, Alabama, by W. J. D. Upshaw.

Enclosed is my Upshaw lineage chart; we will make an effort to get more information on my grandfather, Middleton Upshaw.

Dear Ted;

Thank you for such a complimentary letter on my collection of Upshaw data; it has been quite an undertaking. I am so full of curiosity I will never be really satisfied until we learn what happened to Leroy Upshaw (RS) and his wife, Elizabeth (Bradley) Upshaw.

I have several ideas regarding the whereabouts of Leroy Upshaw (RJ) and his wife. If they had died in Georgia, it seems that we could find some settlement of his estate or something about his widow. However, his ownership of property is not very clear.

Another theory is that they could have gone to South Carolina, as did Beverly Greenwood and his wife (who is thought to be an Upshaw girl) and who, in one document, says he was from Pendleton District, S. C., before going to Alabama. Leroy Upshaw and George Greenwood could have gone to Couth Carolina, then to who knows where, or could have died there. I have looked for them in South Carolina, but in a feeble way. It is very strange that Leroy Upshaw (RS) and George Greenwood, whom he owned land with in Elbert County, Georgia, seem to vanish completely.

The Leroy Upshaw who married Miss Melissa A. Gary in 1861, Butler County, Alabama, is the son of Leroy Upshaw, born 1768 in Virginia, whose wife was named Catherine; she reported on the 1850 Butler County census as having been born in Couth Carolina! It does seem that we should investigate South Carolina for information; Catherine's maiden name would be most helpful. I wonder if one of Leroy and Catherine's children has her name?

I do not know who the Rebecca Upshaw is, shown in the 1850 Butler County, Alabama census, as born in Georgia in 1805, unless she was the widow of Richard Upshaw, brother of Forrester Upshaw, who married Rebecca Elder. Rebecca Upshaw was mentioned in the settlement of John Davis' estate, involving the payment of a note; I don't know if there was any relationship or whether she was only a neighbor, but she lived quite close to several members of John Davis' family.

According to my correspondent, Mrs. Dorsey, in the 1350 Butler County, Alabama, census were: Leroy and Catherine Upshaw in dwelling no. 314; Peter Patterson Roach in dwelling no. 313, married into John Davis' family; in dwelling no. 321 are Samuel and Marcissa Skain, who is John Davis' daughter; in dwelling no. 330 is Andrew Davis, who is John's son; in dwelling no. 331 is John Davis (Jr.), who is the ancestor of Mrs. Dorsey.

It is strange that I, also, have an ancestor in my line on my father's side named Andrew Davis, Jr. They were in Cabarras County, North Carolina, then to Tennessee, where my grandfather, John Davis, was born, then to Mississippi and then to Arkansas where my father, Robert, was born and then to Louisiana.

In 1830 Elbert Co., Ga., census is Rebecca UPSHAW with 1 male 20-30, 1 female 15-20, and 1 female 50-60; in 1830 Walton Co., Ga., census, is Richard UPSHAW with 2 males under 5, 1 male 10-15, 1 male 40-50, 2 females under 5, 2 females 5-10, 1 female 10-15, 1 female 15-20, and 1 female 20-30.

In Butler Co., Ala, on 23 Sep 1856, Rebecca Upshaw sold land for \$400 (Deed Book D). In 1860 Union Parish, La, is listed Rebecca UPSHAW, age 60, born in Ga, and (among others), Elisha UPSHAW, age 28, born in Georgia.

Alexander Wilson UPSHAW and his wife, Z. Frances (Florence?) UPSHAW were the first Upshaws in Union Parish, Louisiana, in 1853. Rebecca UPSHAW sold her land in Alabama in 1856 and her sons bought land in Union Parish, La, in their names. In Farmerville, Union Parish, La, Alexander Wilson UPSHAW sold 320 acres of land to William Elisha UPSHAW and Jonathan W. UPSHAW (brothers) on 8 Aug 1860 (Deed Book J, pg 327).

I need proof showing Richard, Rebecca, and William Elisha UPSHAW together somehow, to prove that William Elisha was their son.

Upshaw Family Journal, Vol. I, page 85: 1830 Georgia census index, DeKalb County, Ga, page 53, "John R. Upshaw" as listed by Delwyn Associates is incorrect. This person is actually John Rapshaw; note my commentary about this name in UFJ, Vol I, page 64.

This name was clarified by Mr. Franklin M. Garrett, Official Historian of the City of Atlanta.

Our member, thrs. Alice Cmith, notes that in UFJ, Vol II, page 52, the census shown as "1850 Winn Parish, Louisiana" should be changed to correctly read "1860 Winn Parish, Louisiana".

Cur member and Contributing Editor, Mr. David W. Morgan, notes that in UFJ, Vol II, page 67, the John Markham listed as having served as a Confederate soldier, is not John B. Markham, husband of Carah E. Upshaw, who died in 1857 as proved by his succession papers which appear on pages 40 and 49. This John Markham is probably the son of James C. and Martha Markham, listed in UFJ Vol II, page 67, in the 1850 Bienville Parish, Louisiana, census.

Mr. Morgan also verifies that Ridlehoover is the correct spelling of the name of the family buried in Post Oak Cemetery, Bell County, Texas, as listed in UFJ, Vol II, page 71.



No restoration was attempted at this time, but Mrs. Shorter put an overseer in the old mansion, continued to plant cotton on the great acres, and entailed the property, which at her death fell to her daughter, Mrs. Fannie Shorter Upshaw. Thus Roseland Plantation passed forever from the possession of the Toney family.

As a citizen he is always first to take part in all progressive movements, and is the leading philanthropist of the community, generously giving financial help wherever needed.

He is a Rotarian, member of the Commercial Club, a deacon of the First Baptist Church and one of it's strongest forces.

He is the citizen who is always ready to promote the progress of the community.

He does not engage actively in politics, but is a Democrat of the type whose influence has weight.

He married Fanny Shorter, daughter of Eli S. and Wylena Lamar Shorter. Their only child is a charming daughter, now at College in New York.

I have in near four hundred acres in cotton and I think if nothing happens to it, it will avridge 1000 pounds per acre. I shall make 8 or 9 hundred barrells of corn. I put up good stacks of foder and I have 130 acres of late corn to pul yet. James is

doing business for me and by his renting 140 acres of land I think he will make 1000 dollars after giving me 40 acres and pays the rent at \$4.14 per acre. My famley are all well. Hoping these few loins may find you and family in good health. I am failing very fast indeed. I were taken with a pain in my left hip in June last and for 6 weeks I could circe rise from my chear, otherwise I enjoy as good health as I did in old Elbert. I expect you would not now me for I am as grey as old Farther was and moreso my weight is 220; my wife ways 180; my children is all with me. William is playing violin; James plays well; Garah F. performs well on the piannerfort. James, I think my crop will clear me 8000 dollars if I can get 8 cents for it and that wont clear me of debt. I sunk a great deal of money by moveing hear and I can't collect any monies in Georgia. I sent James to Georgia in April and he could not collect more than 24 hundred out of 8000. My persessions cost me 15,5,73 dollars besids intrest. I made 71 bags that averridge 450 lb.; it lact a few dollars of bringing 3200 and corn enough to last me this time or the last of September. I have commenced picking cotton but it rains every day; I wish to God it would not rain another drop until Christmas for it will take me until March to gather my crop. I have 3 acres in potatoes and sum of them is as large as your arm; such a country for peas, pumpkins, wartermelons, goards (paper torn). I left a few wartermelons voins in my cotton and I hald home 7 waggons loads at one time. I fed my hogs for 6 weaks.

I should like to hear from you; when you write direct your letter to Glenville, Barber County, Alabama. My wife joins me in our respects to your family and axcept the same yourself. Give my love to all your children. Nothing more thought of present. Yours with respect.

Le Roy Upshaw

Oct. 20th 1841. Dear Unckle, I embrace the present opportunity (with much regret too) to inform you of the occurance that has taken place since this letter was written. That is the death of my Father. He was taken with congestive billous fever the first of Sept and died the 22nd Sept. We employed the Phisicians in the country but they could not produce a reaction. He made a will and left William and myself executors; as you have had the management of estates I should be glad to receive information from you at any time. I should have written to you sooner but I have been absent from home for some time and the family has been verry sick with the fever for four weeks, that is a large portion of them. William is now abed with the fever. Unckle Jim, I would be much pleased to receive a letter from you. You know my situation very well. Do write to me. My brothers and sister join me in love to you and family and family connection. Give my love to all inquiring friends and except a double portion for yourself.

Davis was for 80 acres (see Butler County Deeds, Book D, pg 286); the additional 40 acres (included in the 80) was found in the Tract Record as granted to a Mr. Daniel Clancey as the first owner after it ceased to be public land. Daniel Clancey's wife and A. C. L. Davis' wife were sisters, both daughters of Thomas Skains.
