Dear Ted:

Just in case you do not have the information at hand: General Alexander Bradford Upshaw mentioned in the obituary of his wife, Mrs. Ida T. Upshaw (UFJ Vol IV, no. 4, pg. 123-124) was the son of Edward Ward Upshaw (1824-1878). Also, Edward Ward Upshaw was a son of A. M. M. Upshaw and his first wife, Martha Ann Jones. The Arthur Upshaw of the 1954 obituary was, no doubt, the son of Mrs. Ida T. Upshaw and Alexander B. Upshaw. They had the following children: May, Arthur, Gladys, Leanora, John R., and Muriel Alexandra Upshaw who married Mr. Everett B. Horgan. I would guess that Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Upshaw moved back to New York between 1942 and 1954.

I exchanged letters with Mrs. Horgan in 1971 and she said all the children were deceased except her. She said that Arthur and John R. each had a son but that she had lost track of them. Mrs. Horgan was recuperating from a severe heart attack at that time. I was glad to read about her distinguished mother in the Journal.

On page 120 of the last Journal - Nicholas County, Kentucky, shows that in the 1850 census, page 446, R. L. Upshaw was a student at Western Military Institute at age 16. He is Robert Lewis Upshaw, a son of Arthur M. M. Upshaw and brother of my grandfather, Harney Upshaw. I have his obituary and do not remember if I sent it to you. I will enclose a copy.

I was glad to see Mrs. Roy Monday on the list of members. She is a descendant of Mason Tazwell Bonaparte Upshaw (1797-), son of Capt. James Upshaw and Mary Martin and brother of my great grandfather A. M. M. Upshaw.



GEORGIA

English Crown Grants in Georgia, 1755-1775; published in 9 vols, 1972-1974, by the Surveyor General Department, State of Georgia.

In 1752, after the relinquishment of the Royal Charter of June, 1732, Georgia became a Royal Province and under the English Crown and it's Royal Governors, fee simple grants were made to the land which gave a clear title to the grantees. These Royal Grants, in the Georgia Surveyor General Department of the Office of the Secretary of State, begin in 1755. The Parishes of Georgia were St. Paul, St. George, St. Matthew, St. Philip, Christ Church, St. John, St. Andrew, St. James, St. David, St. Patrick, St. Thomas, and St. Mary.

The Christian Index; published at Penfield, Ga.; issue of 14 Oct 1847, page 335, column 2:

Departed this life, on the 19th of August, Mrs. Rhoda Upshaw, consort of Haston Upshaw and daughter of George and Elizabeth Oglesby, formerly of Elbert County, Georgia, in the 41st year of her age, after a short but severe illness. She joined the Baptist church at Dove's Creek, Elbert County, in the year 1828; and, from that time to the day of her death, gave the most undoubted evidence that she was a child of God. She was as affectionate a wife and as tender a mother as ever lived; she was also a dutiful and pious Christian, not excelled by any, and beloved by all who were intimately acquainted with her. She has left a tender husband and nine living children, together with a great many friends, to mourn her loss; but they sorrow not as those who have no hope, for we believe she is gone where the wicked cease from troubling and the weary are at rest. The writer of this brief notice was called to her bed-side but a short time before she expired; she was in possession of her right mind, good reason and strong faith in God; she observed to me that she wanted me to speak some sweet word to her before she died. I named several of God's promises, when she exclaimed that she saw her way clear; and surely she died in the triumphs of faith in God.

The Christian Index; published at Macon, Ga.; issue of Tuesday, 29 July 1862, page 3, column 6:

Died in the Hospital, Charleston, S. C., July the 13th, in the 22nd year of his age, John W. Upshaw, of Union Parish, Louisiana.

The subject of this notice was a native of Georgia, but was removed in his youth and attained to mature years in the first named State. He was a soldier in the Confederate service for a year prior to his death, he having volunteered at the commencement of the war, serving a short period at Camp Moore, near New Orleans, Louisiana, in a company subsequently disbanded, and then joining Company D, 4th Louisiana Battalion.

This Battalion, after their campaign in Western Virginia, having been ordered to the coast of this State, were sent to aid in the defence of Charleston. In the engagement which ensued on James Island, the subject of our notice was so severely wounded in one of his legs as to render amputation necessary — this he never survived, but lingered to the above date when he expired. He professed religion some years ago, and united himself to a Baptist church. His prospects for the future, in view of his approaching end, may be seen from an extract taken from a letter, communicating his death to the writer of this notice:

"I am sorry to announce to you the death of our beloved brother Upshaw, who departed this life, in hope of a better, on the night of the 13th, in Charleston, S. C. He sent word for us to do better, and prepare to meet him in glory. I trust these words will be stamped on our hearts, and that our memories will bear in mind our friend, who, without doubt, now seeth not as through a glass darkly, but enjoys the presence of the Lord, face to face, where he can join in praise with those who have gone before." Physically, brother Upshaw was strong and active. Mentally, those who knew him thought he possessed intelligence superior to his advantages. What he was as a Christian, we who do not see the heart do not wholly know.

He is now before the Great Judge of all - far above the mists and doubts which obscure the judgement of men. But this we know, that even if he had some infirmities, he evinced a disposition to serve his Maker, and was seldom indifferent to the subject of religion. In view of these considerations, those who survive him have "hope in his death."



Headright and Bounty Grants

The first effective land Act was the Act of February 17, 1783 (as amended by the Act of August 1, 1783) entitled an "Act for opening the land office and for other purposes therein mentioned." This Act allowed a man to take up 200 acres upon his own headright free of any charge except office fees for survey and grant, plus an additional 50 acres upon the head of each member of his family at sales prices ranging from one to four shillings per acre, and it limited any grant to a maximum of 1000 acres.

The machinery for granting land, as set up by this Act, was as follows: The applicant for land would appear before the land court of the county in which he desired land, composed of at least five Justices, and after making oath as to the size of his family, including slaves, would obtain a warrant of survey. The county surveyor would then lay out his land, keep a copy of the plat of survey in his office, and forward a copy to the Surveyor General.

GEORGIA

By the Court of Justices of the county of Wilkes To David Criswell Esq. County Surveyor for said County.

You are hereby authorized and required to admeasure and lay out or cause to be admeasured & laid out unto John Upshaw - a tract of land which shall contain five hundred acres in Wilkes county, two hundred acres in lieu of an old Warrant of John Rogers's and three hundred acres on the Headrights of John Rogers -

Taking special care that the same has not heretofore been laid out to any person or persons and you are hereby also directed & required to record the plat of the same in your office and transmit a copy thereof together with this warrant to the Surveyor General within two years from this date. Given under my hand as Senior Justice of said Court this 2d day of April 1787.

Land Lotteries

The method of distributing Georgia's newly acquired territories by Lottery was not used by any other state. Simply, it was thus: After the Lottery was authorized by an Act of the Legislature, citizens of Georgia would register in their respective counties of residence, if they were eligible under certain qualifications. Their names taken in their counties of residence, and the lot and district numbers submitted by the surveyors were sent to the State Capital (then Milledgeville) and commissioners appointed by the Governor drew the names and numbers from two seperate wheels or drums. Subsequently the fortunate drawer would take out a grant to the lot he drew, paying the grant fee specified. If he did NOT take out a grant, the lot reverted to the State. There were no requirements for cultivation or residence of any lot drawn and granted in the Lotteries.

Some persons drew a blank ticket. If there were, for example, 1000 land lots and 2000 persons registered to draw, there would be 1000 blank tickets added so that the tickets would equal the number of persons drawing. With the exception of the 1805 Land Lottery (which has been published) the State has no record of those who drew blank tickets.

In all cases, any person who was a "fortunate drawer" in any previous Land Lottery was excluded from participation in a current Lottery.

The "date granted" for land is the date the Governor of Georgia signed the grant, thereby legalizing it, as shown in records of the Surveyor General's Office of Georgia. In all cases there should be a deed or deeds recorded in the counties where land was granted showing the Lottery recipient, or his heirs, selling the land at a later date.

Confederate Records

The following names have been taken from the "Alphabetical Card File" at the Civil Mar Records Section, Georgia Department of Archives and History, Atlanta, Georgia, 30334, and reference to that file should be made when making inquirey to them.

Although the "Alphabetical Card File" contains more names than any other list yet created, it has two disadvantages. First, the compilers gathered names from some sources of questionable reliability as well as reliable sources. Also, the cards do not always show the source of the information, and it is therefore often impossible to locate the documents from which the information was taken.

The principle advantage of the "Alphabetical Card File" is that many documents included in the records of the Governor's office and the office of the Georgia Adjutant and Inspector General are indexed in it.

- Records indexed in the "Alphabetical Card File" include the following:

 1) COMPILED SERVICE RECORDS of men assigned to Georgia units or units designated "Confederate". Most of these included in ACF.
- 2) CONFEDERATE PENSION RECORDS for disabled indigent soldiers beginning in 1879 and for widows in 1891. Few of these included in ACF.
- 3) LETTERS RECEIVED BY THE GOVERNOR for years 1861_1865. Most of these in ACF.
- 4) "Lists of men subject to military duty compiled March 4, 1862, under the Governor's proclamation of Feb. 11, 1862", which includes "every able-bodied white male citizen, as well as alien, between the ages of 18 and 45 years, not already in the Confederate or State military service, or exempt by law" as of 4 March 1862. These are names of all men in the Georgia Militia. All of these included in ACF.

- 5) "Militia Enrollment Lists Compiled Under the Act of Dec. 14, 1863, for Re-organizing the Georgia Militia", which is more commonly known as the "Joe Brown census". It was a compilation in January 1864 of these lists which include every white male between 16 and 60 years of age and not in actual military service. All of these included in ACF.
- 6) ORIGINAL MUSTER ROLLS of the Georgia State Troops and the Georgia State Line. The Georgia State Troops were volunteer soldiers of the State (rather than the Confederate government) in service for six months from Oct. 1861 to April 1862. The Georgia State Line were volunteer soldiers of the State in service from early 1863 to the end of the war. Men in these units are not usually included in the COMPILED SERVICE RECORDS and these rolls often constitute the only proof of their service. All of these included in ACF.
